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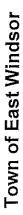

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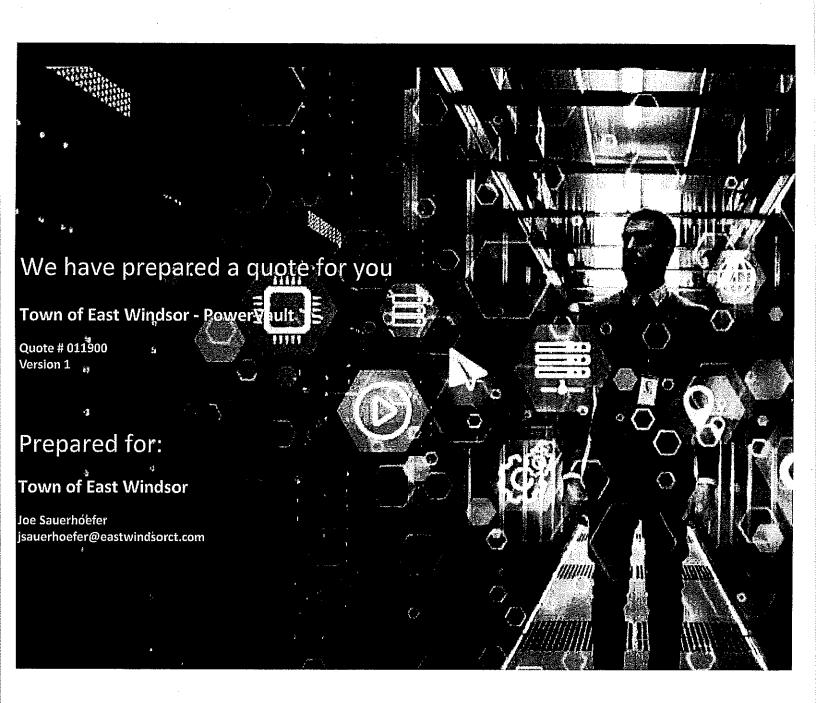

Professional Services to Configure Servers used for NexGen Applications to new servers. The Town of East Windsor IT staff or IT Vendor will build 3 virtual servers with properly licensed Server 2019 or 2022. The 3 new servers will replace NEXGENSQL1, NEXGENSQL2 and NEXGENAPP.

The Town of East Windsor or IT Vendor will grant EWPD1\Nexgen local administrator rights on all three new servers. The Town of East Windsor or IT Vendor will mount the SQL Server 2019 or 2022 installer on both servers that will host the new SQL environment.

NexGen technical staff will install RMM client agent on all three new servers. NexGen Technical staff will install SQL Server on both new SQL Servers and SQL Reporting Services and SQL Analysis Services on one of the new SQL servers. NexGen Technical Staff will work with East Windsor IT or IT Vendor to create a new Windows Server Failover Cluster for the new SQL AG and add both SQL servers to it. NexGen Technical Staff will install all the NexGen Services, API's and Webservices that are currently on NEXGENAPP to the new application server. On cutover day the IP Address from NEXGENAPP will be transferred to the new application server so that all the State CJIS NATS connect to the new application server.

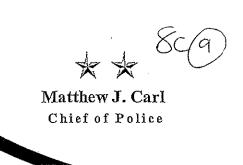
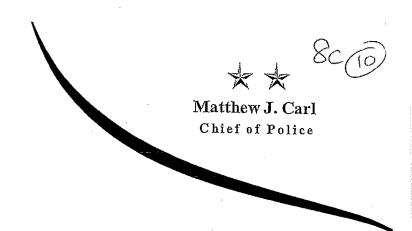

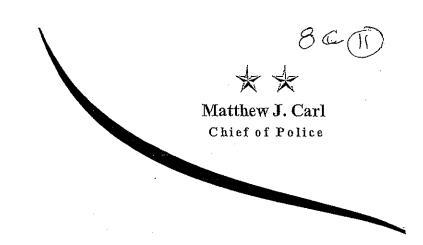


Purpose

to successfully encompass the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) mission in helping people before, during and after disasters, modern Emergency Management Units must consistently update and improve their technological capabilities. In line with FEMA's Emergency Management goals, the use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV) has proven to be a cost effective force multiplier when used in conjunction with adapted procedures to increase first responder safety, reduce the of loss of life, minimize property loss and damage to the environment and to protect our jurisdiction from all threats and hazards.

This proposal will serve to create a full picture of the history and background of the use of UAV's including a comparison of available UAV platforms, a breakdown of relevant costs, and a final recommendation on the acquisition of a platform and necessary training to build upon our current base and continue to maintain a progressive, functional and effective Drone Program for the Town.





History

The term Unmanned Aerial Vehicle is currently defined as an aircraft piloted by remote control or onboard computers. As demand, production and innovation take hold, the current understating of the technology is a far cry from its origin.

As with many budding technologies, the origins history of Unmanned Aerial Vehicles use can be traced back to Victorian era, military advancement military beginnings. While not generally considered UAV's today, although it was a far cry from the UAV's of today the first recognized use of an unmanned aerial operation utilized the balloon. the first noted thought process leading to our modern understanding has root in balloons. On July 15, 1849 Austrian forces released several balloon's loaded with explosives and shrapnel over the sieged city of Venice. (1) Improvements in flight and balloon technology allowed later Balloon UAV's as the terminology changed, to include that which had the capability to return successfully after a mission.

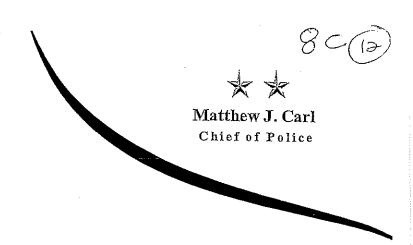
With the Wright brother's first flight on December 17, 1903, the landscape of military fighting began to rapidly change. The United States military began its development of Unmanned aircraft in the First World War with the inception of pilotless aircraft and the Kettering Bug, a "self-flying aerial torpedo." WWI was a catalyst for aerial technology as improved firearm technology spread battlefields ever wider, ground based reconnaissance techniques no longer proved sufficient. Thusly the first truly modern mission utilizing UAV technology occurred at Neuve Chapelle in 1915 when the British At the basis held true as technology increased allowing the British military to utilized aerial photography in the Battle of Neuve Chapelle in 1915, leading to gain a tactical advantage through airborne surveys of the understanding of German trench fortifications in the region. (2) After the war, production and research was largely put on hold due to funding. (3)

During World War II, the U.S Military began the use of "radio planes," Unmanned Aerial Vehicles designed to provide target practice for anti-aircraft operators. (4) At that time, Reginald Denny created the Radio plane OQ-2, a radio-controlled aircraft, the first mass produced UAV product in the United States. (2) As time went on, UAV's have been utilized in military operations across the globe and by 2015, more than 50 unmanned aircraft vehicles were under production and being considered among nearly all branches of service. (4) When discussing UAV's many immediately call to mind the "Predator" model, created in the 1990's and deployed in 2000. (4,5)

Since that time, the use of UAV's has increased tremendously in not only the military, but in other sectors as well. As technology continues to evolve, the private market has seen a recent boom in community size, with a projection of more \$13 million over the next three years. (4,5) With an emphasis on safety benefits as well as affordability, the Law Enforcement community is far from the only group looking to capitalize on the possibilities to be explored in the use of UAV's.

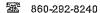


Since the Mid 2010's There has been a significant uptake in the use of drones in municipal police forces both domestically and abroad. Drones have proven useful in a multitude of roles including search and rescue, active shooters, crime scene analysis, traffic collisions, and surveillance.(6) The most wide spread and most successful use of drones has been in a search and rescue role, where a drone can assist on the ground personnel in covering a wide swath of area with minimal response time and greatly reduced operational cost when compared to other aerial search vehicles such as low flying aircraft and helicopters.(7,8) Towns which have adopted drone programs have begun to measure their success. For example in Ensenda, Mexico, a single drone was credited to providing surveillance that led to 500 Arrests, a 10% total drop in Crime rate and 30% drop in the rate of robberies. (9)

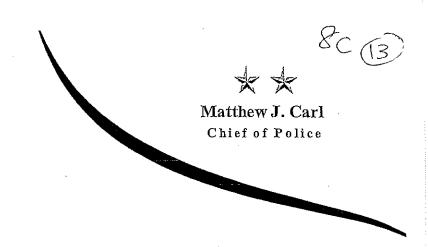

Necessity

The Town of East Windsor, Connecticut covers 26.2 square miles and is home to over 11, 176 residents. (1) Launched in late 2019, The East Windsor Police Department's Unmanned Aireal Vehicle Unit Team utilized the Mavic 2 Enterprise Dual, with on board thermal imagining and four FAA Certified Part 107 Pilots. It was soon realized that staffing minimums and employee turnover limited deployment of the UAV during operations requiring visual observers and multiple resources. Manpower concerns were soon combined with regular weather patterns found to be outside of the Dual's capabilities and an outpaced camera that offered inadequate assistance in the field.

Even with the aforementioned limitations and coupled with Covid Pandemic, the town did not require any fewer services or creative solutions. Since the agencies first UAV deployment in late 2019, the 26 sworn officers of the East Windsor Police Department have responded to over 48, 781 calls for service, a number which does not include special operations and out of town Task Force's.

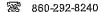
Broadening the range of partnership to include collaboration with Emergency Management peers in the Fire Department would allow for proper implementation of updated UAV's to increase safety for the public as well as first responders to calls for serve while decreasing the amount of time and resources needed to further the Department Mission of preserving public peace and order, preventing and detecting crime, apprehending offenders, and the protecting persons and property.

There are proven uses cases for drones in several areas of emergency response including, missing persons, fire investigation, pursuit and surveillance, crime scene analysis, traffic incident reporting, hostage negotiation, active shooter scenarios, bomb investigation, and drug interdiction. When utilized correctly a UAV and reduce response time while increasing effectiveness acting as a force multiplier, assisting first responders in better understanding a situation both before they arrive on scene and throughout the crisis resolution and investigative process. The biggest impact these devices yield is keeping those on scene safe by increasing situational awareness and performing duties that may be deemed too dangerous for a human.

From January 1, 2020 to the writing of this proposal, more than 43 persons within the town of East Windsor were reported as missing and could have benefited from the departments ability to conduct an aerial area search. By utilizing a UAV, emergency services can quickly access area's dangerous to a foot search and allow for attachments that can pinpoint persons using thermal imagining to assist in a speedy and possibly lifesaving recovery.

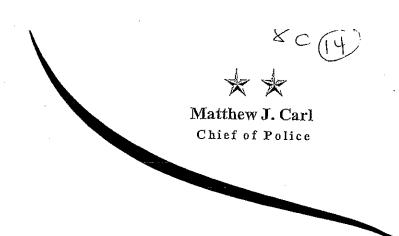
In the same time period, UAV's could have been utilized for scene photography in many of 1,755 reported accidents, 623 arson/fire department assists and 205 public hazards. Stock model imaging for today's commercial UAVs GIS mapping software allows for accurate representation of the totality of the scene and can assist in prompt

measurement and recording. In the event of a natural disaster or severe weather, UAS can be deployed to map response routes and survey damage.

Officer safety would have been greatly increased in the overhead surveillance at any of the 607 panic/holdup, burglary alarms or logged special detail/stake out assignments and could have been incredibly useful in the many times our officers have searched on foot for loose live stock. Fleeing felons can be monitored by air, mitigating danger to officers attempting apprehension and protect the public, especially in cases where ground level line of sight is less than ideal in many of our town's rural property.

Training

Initial onboarding would require the successful application, examination and completion of the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Part 107 Remote Pilot Certificate licensing. With greater details provided below, said licensing process requires the passing of an initial aeronautical knowledge exam. Historically, members of the East Windsor Police Department have utilized Dart Drone's Part 107 Test Prep Course in both the in person and online applications to study for and successfully pass the exam.

Upon attaining a Part 107 certificates, operators will be best served undergoing familiarization training specific to their UAV. This is separate and distinct from Basic Flight Training courses that offers those unfamiliar with UAV operations an opportunity to utilize a training specific UAV prior to on the job deployment. It should be noted that Basic Flight Training is generally limited to the training Host's available models, which may not coincide with the town or agencies UAV.

Part 107 Requirements

Per the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA):

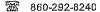
"In order to fly your drone under the FAA's Small UAS Rule (Part 107), you must obtain a Remote Pilot Certificate from the FAA. This certificate demonstrates that you understand the regulations, operating requirements, and procedures for safely flying drones. To become a pilot you must:

- · Be at least 16 years old
- · Be able to read, speak, write, and understand English
- · Be in a physical and mental condition to safely fly a drone
- \cdot Pass the initial aeronautical knowledge exam: "Unmanned Aircraft General Small (UAG)"

Requirements for Remote Pilot Certificate:

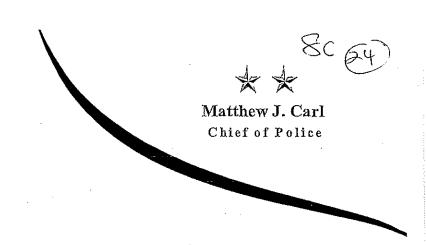
- · Must be easily accessible by the remote pilot during all UAS operations
- · Certificate holders must complete an <u>online recurrent training</u> every 24 calendar months to maintain aeronautical knowledge recency"
- · Recertification is online and available at no cost

Legislative Concerns

S.B. No. 3 Session Year 2024 AN ACT CONCERNING CONSUMER PROTECTION.

Section 4 of S.B. 3

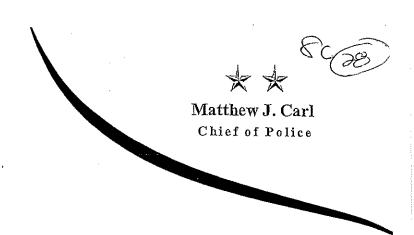
Beginning on October 1, 2024 and except as provided in subdivisions (2) and (3) of this subsection:

- (A) No public entity shall purchase any small unmanned aircraft system assembled or manufactured by a covered foreign entity; and
- (B) No state funds, including, but not limited to, any state funds awarded or paid pursuant to a contract, cooperative agreement or grant, shall be used to purchase, operate or repair a small unmanned aircraft system assembled or manufactured by a covered foreign entity.
- (2) The provisions of subsection (1) of this subsection shall not be construed to impair any contact entered into before October 1, 2024.
- (3) The Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management may waive the prohibitions established in subdivision (1) of this subsection if:
- (A) The person seeing such a waiver submitted to the Office of Policy and Management, in a form and manner prescribed by the Secretary of the office of Policy and Management, (i) an application specifying the need for such a waiver, and (ii) an application fee in the amount of forty dollars; and
- (B) The Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management (i) has reviewed the application submitted pursuant to the subparagraph (A)(i) of the this subdivision and determined that such waiver is necessary (i) due to exigent circumstances, (iii) to counter another unnamed aircraft system, or (iii) for the purpose of any criminal investigation, and (ii) submits to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of the matters relating to consumer protection an notice disclosing such waiver and the reasons therefor.
- (c) (1) Not later than October 1, 2024, and public entity that operates a small unmanned aircraft system assembled or manufactured by a covered foreign entity shall submit to the Office of Policy and Management, in a form and manner prescribed by the Secretary of the Office of Police and Management:

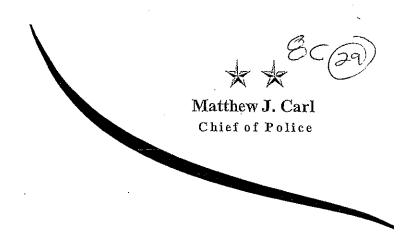


- (A) A Comprehensive plan to discontinue operation of such small unmanned aircraft system; and

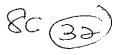

(A) The person seeking such waiver submits to the Office of Policy and Management, in a form and manner prescribed by the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management, (i) an application specifying the need for such waiver, and (ii) an application fee in the amount of forty dollars; and
(B) The Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management (i) has reviewed the application submitted pursuant to subparagraph (A)(i) of this subdivision and determined that such waiver is necessary (I) due to exigent circumstances, (II) to counter another unmanned aircraft system, or (III) for the purpose of any criminal investigation, and (ii) submits to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to consumer protection a notice disclosing such waiver and the reasons therefor.
(c) (1) Not later than October 1, 2024, any public entity that operates a small unmanned aircraft system assembled or manufactured by a covered foreign entity shall submit to the Office of Policy and Management, in a form and manner prescribed by the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management:
(A) A comprehensive plan to discontinue operation of such smal

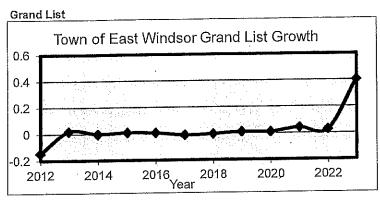

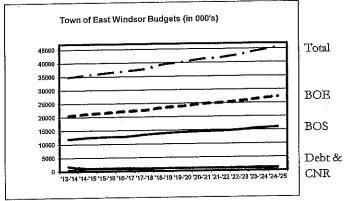
The chart displays Grand List growth. There was a revaluation performed for the 2023 Grand List as required by the State of Connecticut. Individual taxpayers will feel the impact of revaluation differently. The mill rate will decrease. Grand List growth helps offset the tax increases from increased annual expenditures.

Budgets

Town department heads and commissions requested \$17,924,124, an increase of \$1,333,935 or 8.04%. The Board of Selectmen (BOS) approved a budget in the amount of \$16,982,492, an increase of \$392,303 or 2.36% increase over the current year. The BOS also requested \$1,214,310 in Capital Improvement Projects, an increase of \$23,810 or 2%, over the current year, which continues to include a \$200,000 reallocation from Debt Service. Debt Service is \$946,697.

The Superintendent of Schools requested \$27,939,629 an increase of \$1,442,880 or 5.45%. The Board of Education (BOE) approved a budget of 27,755,446 an increase of

\$1,258,446 or 4.75% over the current year. The BOE increase is primarily driven by increases in employees Medical Insurance selection and the ending of ESSER Grant funding.



The BOF proposed budget uses \$1,200,000 in Fund Balance to offset the mil rate increase, the same amount used in the current year. Use of Fund Balance as a revenue offset is the only legal way to return surplus tax dollars to taxpayers.

The budgets were presented to the BOF on March 20, 2024. A public hearing was held on March 27, 2024, at which time two taxpayers spoke in favor of the budgets. The BOF held several budget meetings in late March and early April to review the budgets in detail.

The BOF approved the BOS Operating Budget of \$16,982,492, an increase of \$392,303 or 2.36% over the current year. The BOF reduced the BOE Operating Budget by \$410,800 to \$27,344,646, an increase of \$847,896 or 3.2% over the current year. The BOF approved the Capital Non Recurring Budget at \$1,214,310, an increase of \$23,810 or 2% over the current year. The BOF approved Debt Service at \$946,697, a increase of \$18,564 or 2% over the current year.

The BOF voted unamimously to approve a \$45,541,448 expenditure budget, an increase of \$1,262,509 or 2.85%.

The funds requested here are needed to provide town services at committed levels. This would result in a <u>mil rate decrease</u> of 9.72 mils from 34.28 to 24.56.

The East Windsor-BBFD is requesting a budget of \$1,005,505, which includes \$200,000 in Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) funding for the purchase of a replacement Engine. The mil rate for the BBFD would be 1.6 a 36% decrease.

The Board urges you to vote on the recommended budgets for FY 2024-25.
