"Selectmen's Report - April 18, 2024

On April 9, 2024 I attended the Warehouse Point Fire District's Budget Public Hearing and meeting. The proposed FY 2024-2025 Budget is \$1,357,012.54. The current mil rate TOWN OF EAST WINDSOR
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is 2.3, but due to an increase in the grand list, the proposed mil rate would be 1.8. A vote on the proposed budget will be held on May 6, 2024 at 7:00PM at Station One at 89 Bridge Street. There were sixty five fire calls in the month of March and at this time one hundred twenty six out of one hundred ninety one inspections have been completed in FY 2023-2024.

The Board of Education met on April 10, 2024. There were twenty two entries in the Limerick Contest this year and the three winners from the school district were announced. Each received a gift card to Frankie B's Bakery, which is a new establishment here in town. Congratulations to Abigail Starvish, Violet Stephenson and Kristina Keyes.

There was a Curriculum Update given by high school teacher Mike Mosher on a new course he's teaching called Sustainable Agriculture. There are currently twenty four 11th and 12th graders enrolled in this one semester course. The goal of the course is to offer students the chance to understand food production, social inequalities in access to food and to learn how to cultivate their own. With a grant, a greenhouse was purchased and is set up in the courtyard where students have been planting microgreens and seeds for outdoor crops. What's really neat is that they've passed on some of the items they've grown to the culinary class to cook with.

There was some discussion regarding the Board of Finance's cuts to the Board of Education budget and some brainstorming on how to handle this after the May 14th Referendum vote.

I attended the Veterans Commission meeting on April 11, 2024. The group is still accepting orders for pavers in memory of a loved one at the Joseph Tracy Veterans Memorial Green. ### Agreement

This Agreement is made as of the date last signed below, by and between the Town of East Windsor, a municipality located within the County of Hartford in the State of Connecticut, acting through its First Selectman (hereinafter called "Town") and Ondrick Materials & Recycling, LLC, 22 Industry Road, Chicopee, MA 01020 (hereinafter termed the "Company" or "Contractor"). The Town and Company may be referred to collectively as the "Parties" or individually as a "Party."

The Parties to this Agreement each in consideration of the Agreements on the part of the other herein contained have agreed, and by these presents do hereby agree, as follows:

1. Project: The Project is as follows, as noted on the Pavement Restoration 2023 and Company's Bid/Proposal received April 24, 2023, both of which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein:

- 2. The Contract Documents consist of this Contract, together with all attachments including but not limited to, the Bid/Proposal, Drawings, Exhibits and Addenda issued before execution of the Contract, all of which are included as if fully set forth herein. If there is any conflict between this Contract and any of the attachments, this Contract controls.
- 3. Scope of the Work: Contractor shall provide roadway milling, roadway reclamation, pavement removal, curb removal, pavement patching, adjusting, and replacing utility manhole covers and gate boxes as needed, curbing placement, pavement shimming, placement of new pavement, pavement markings, paving driveway entrances, restoring lawn areas and associated work in various areas throughout the Town. Superpave is to be used for the road pavement as described in the Invitation to Bid all in conformance with the Company's Submittal. Contractor's performance shall be a turnkey installation with no additions, change orders or amendments, unless requested by the Town. Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, supplies, tools, equipment, other facilities and things necessary for or incidental to properly perform the Work.
- 4. Place of Installation:

5. Schedule and Time is of the essence. Contractor hereby agrees to commence the work under this Contract on the date to be specified in a written Notice to Proceed from the Town. The Contractor will provide a schedule of performance to Town in seven (7) days following the execution of this agreement. Town has a right to change and adjust Contractor's schedule consistent with the Work. The Contractor then has 48 hours to request a modification to Contractor's schedule or such schedule changes by Town are deemed conclusive. Time is of the essence for the Contractor to complete and perform all of its obligations under this

### Agreement.

- 6. Payment. Town shall pay, and the Contractor shall receive, as full compensation for fulfilling everything required of the Contractor under this Contract at the time of the final acceptance of the Work by the Town after final inspection by the Town, in accordance with the unit costs for the work performed as stated in the Bid/Proposal, a copy of which is appended to and is made a part of this Contract.
- 7. Equal Employment Opportunity and Labor Compliance: The contractor will not willfully discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, ancestry, sex, age, national origin, sexual orientation, or physical handicap. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, ancestry, sex, age, national origin, sexual orientation, or physical handicap. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.
- 8. Wage Rates. Contractor acknowledges that it has conducted its own independent investigation of the wage rates to be paid and that it has not relied upon any statements or representations by Town with respect to such matters. Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable Connecticut prevailing wage laws.
- 9. Certified Payrolls. If this Project is a Prevailing Wage Project under Connecticut or federal law, Contractor, as requested by Town, shall furnish certified copies of all payrolls in the manner prescribed by Town. Certified Payroll Reports must be made available upon request no later than ten (10) calendar days after the week that Contractor's work force performed work at the job site and must conform with the actual hours of work performed at the job site as stated/certified on Contractor's daily reports.
- 10. Audits. All invoiced items should have timesheets, direct costs or other back-up documentation available if requested by Town. Contractor shall cooperate fully and timely by providing back-up documentation to Town If requested.
- 11. Non-Assignment of Agreement without Consent. Due to the unique services required by this Agreement this Agreement and the Work may not be assigned in whole or in-part without expressed written permission from Town by a "Letter of Consent to Assign." Should Town agree to the assignment Contractor shall remain fully responsible for all work performed, quality of such work and meeting schedule requirements; unless specifically waived in the Letter of Consent. The assignment shall not cause in an increase in costs as a result of the assignment.
- 12. Independent Contractor. It is recognized that Contractor is not an employee of Town and shall pay all taxes, insurance, withholdings, workers' compensation or other fees associated with performance of this Agreement. Contractor shall set their own working hours to be scheduled/coordinated with Contractor and retain their own office locations.
- 13. Standard of Care. Contractor will perform all services with the highest standard of care common within their industry and disclose any significant schedule, costs or performance impacts to Contractor in a timely manner in order to avoid delays, liability, or cost increases.

Contractor will at a minimum provide to Town weekly updates, by the Tuesday following the week in which the Work occurred, on the progress of the work items contained in the Scope of Work. These updates shall be in writing in a format agreed to by both parties prior to the start of Work

14. Indemnity. To the fullest extent permitted by law, for only the portion of any claim attributable to Contractor, or its subcontractors, agents, employees or representatives, Contractor shall defend, indemnity, and hold harmless the Town and its agents, officers, officials, employees, consultants, and employees ("Indemnitees") from and against all injuries, claims (including property damage, personal injury and death, as well as any claims relating to use of Contractor equipment or vessels), damages, losses, fines, penalties, and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs), of whatever kind or nature, that may arise from or relate to, directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, from or out of, any act, claim, error, omission or willful misconduct relating to the performance of the Work by Contractor or anyone directly or indirectly employed by Contractor for whose acts Contractor may be liable. Any acceptance of Contractor's services by Town shall not operate as a waiver of the right to indemnification. Contractor's obligation to indemnify and hold harmless shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of indemnity that would otherwise exist as to any party or person.

### 15. Insurance.

a. General Requirements: Contractor shall procure and maintain in effect, at its sole expense, not less than the insurance coverage's and limits of insurance as specified within the "Required Coverage" indicated below which is an integral part of this agreement. Such insurance shall be maintained with insurers, policy forms and deductibles satisfactory to Town. If Contractor uses existing coverage to comply with these requirements and that coverage does not meet the requirements set forth within Contractor agrees to amend, supplement and/or endorse the existing coverage.

Contractor will keep all policies and endorsements in force as long as may be necessary to protect Town is interests. Any acceptance of insurance certificates or endorsements by Town shall in no way limit or relieve Contractor of its duties and the responsibilities assumed by this Agreement.

Prior to commencing the performance of the services referenced herein, Contractor shall procure, and thereafter maintain, at its own expense, for as long as this Agreement is in effect, the insurance coverage as set forth below in a form and from insurers acceptable to Town; and shall provide Town with certificates evidencing such coverage. Each certificate shall state that the insurer will give Town thirty (30) days prior written notice of any cancellation or material change in the policy(les):

### b. Required Coverage:

- Workers' Compensation insurance, including Occupational Disease insurance, meeting Connecticut's statutory regulrements, in an amount of at least \$1,000,000;
- Employer's Liability Insurance in an amount of at least \$1,000,000;

- o Automobile insurance with limits of liability for bodily injury and property damage of \$1,000,000 per accident. Such insurance shall apply on an "any auto" basis.

No delay by Town or Contractor in exercising any of its rights or remedies hereunder upon a breach by the other party shall be deemed to be a waiver of such rights or remedies. No express or implied waiver by either party of any breach by the other party hereunder shall in any way be, or construed to be, a waiver of future or subsequent breach.




