Time Capsule: No updates.

Planning Committee:

<u>Wood Memorial Library</u>: We will be meeting with Jessica Vogelgesang at the Wood Memorial Library in South Windsor on Monday August 7, 2017 at 4 pm.

<u>Vintage Baseball</u>: The vintage baseball team has sent us photos from the current season and given us permission to use them for advertising.

<u>Winter Fest</u>: We changed the date of the Winter Festival so it doesn't interfere with the Abby's Walk Gala.

<u>Reenactment</u>: The Revolutionary War Reenactment will cost around \$1500. We can look for sponsors to pay for the rider, or the cost of one of the display tents.

Food Truck Festival: Scout Hall is donating their rental fee as we take over their grounds on June 16, 2018. We will need to rent port-a-potties and washing stations; Ceil Donahue will ask Richard Pippin. We also need a small dumpster; Ceil is going to see if we can get one donated or at a discount. The ATM machine will be free; it is from the same company that the Enfield Food Truck Festival uses. Ceil is going to try to get the Fife and Drum Corp to play at the Food Truck Festival. The Warehouse Point Fire Department has said we can use the town's Bounce Fire Truck. We will ask the boy and girl scouts to help park cars and empty trash cans. Ceil talked to the police department; we do not need a police presence. We can have parking on one side of the street. The police will put no parking

signs on the other side of the street for the day of the event. Scout Hall will have room for about 200 cars. We are going to ask the Zion Church down the road if we can use their parking lot for the volunteers to park.

We are going to try to find sponsors for specific costs for each of our events.

We still need more volunteers. This is a very involved committee. If anyone wants to help organize one or more events, please email the 250th committee at

Fundraising Committee:

The planning committee will try to get sponsors for specific events. The fundraising committee will raise the money we need for the September Community Day picnic and parade. Andy Hoffman spoke to Jim Nealson who suggested we ask for money for specific items rather than a general donation to the 250th. For example, if we get a sponsor to pay for the extras at the Masquerade Ball (masks, champagne glasses, etc), we would advertise that it is sponsored by that company. We will have door prizes at the ball; some suggestions to research include special seating at the high school graduation, ride a police car to school, a cord of wood, and products and services donated by town businesses. Press & Advertising Committee:

There are articles about the Acadia book in the North Central News and the Courant Community paper.

Journal Inquirer Advertising: we reviewed the costs of the 4-6 page pull out advertisements (\$2000 for 4 pages) and the stickers on the front of the paper (\$1,225 for 25,000 stickers). We decided to use the stickers for our events throughout 2018. If money permits, we will create a 4 page pull-out in September 2018 thanking everyone for their support and listing all of our sponsors.

OTHER BUSINESS:

• <u>Directional Signs</u>: We will need directional road signs with arrows leading people to our different events. The estimated cost is \$28 for a double-sided 2' x 1'. Bob Maynard said we can have his old campaign signs to paint over them ourselves.
