**Paul Anderson made a motion to accept the September 18, 2018 minutes; Bill Thim seconded the motion. The motion passed.**

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**Time Capsule Committee:** The Time Capsule Burial was on Sunday September 23, 2018. The submissions were thoughtful and varied; they truly represented both East Windsor and 2018. We were able to fit all of the submissions into the time capsule. The exact location of the buried time capsule is recorded at the town hall so they will be able to find it in 2068. Carol Hall, Chris Davis, Bob Maynard and Rebecca Talamini spoke at the ceremony. The invocation was led by Reverend Dr. Thomas V. Calderone from the First Congregational Church of East Windsor in Scantic, and the benediction was led by Reverend Stuart H. Pinette from St Marianne Cope Parish.

The Time Capsule was lowered into the ground at exactly 2:50 pm. Joe Sauerhoefer dug the hole, lowered the time capsule, covered the hole, and evened the landscape around the time capsule.

**Events Committee:**

The events were successful. We hope everyone enjoyed them.

**Fundraising Committee:**

Tom Talamini suggested we should add Abby's Helping Hand to our list of charities receiving our leftover money since Joe Sauerhoefer did so much to help with digging up the 1968 time capsule and burying the 2018 time capsule.

The bills for the Police Department and Smith Bus Company will go directly to the town

**Promotion and Merchandise Committee:**

We sold \$859 in merchandise at Heritage Day. Baseball caps are sold out; we only have knit hats left. Coins are still available for purchase. The leftover merchandise will be sold until January at the Trolley Museum, Broad Brook Library, and Town Hall.

Girl Scout Patch: The Girl Scouts are asking for permission to create an EW250 logo patch that the girls can earn. Since there isn't a copy write infringement, Rebecca will email the logo to the head of the Girl Scouts so they can create the EW250 patch.

Heritage Day Signs: Only the signs at Scout Hall and in Windsorville are left to be picked up.

Heritage Day was a success. Many people attended the picnic after the parade. Some went home during early evening, but most returned after night for the fireworks. Thanks to our fireworks sponsors and donated pyrotechnic talent, the fireworks display was one of the best in recent memory.
