I. Call to Order/Attendance

At 6:31 p.m. Debbie Williams called the meeting to order. The commission members present were Kristin Blume, Sharon Aprea, Bernie Duffy, Christina Posniak, Debbie Williams, and Rusty Williams; also including commission liaison, Sarah Muska and Jeff Holcombe.

II. Approval of minutes of 2/27/24 Special Meeting

Debbie inquired if we had a chance to review the minutes from the February 27 meeting. Rusty made a motion to approve the February minutes and Kristin seconded this motion concluding that all were in favor.

IV. Discussion of 2.27.24 public participation/Committee to Commission status/budget presentation updates/email from Keith

Debbie thanked committee members for our passionate support of the committee. Sarah Muska asked about the meeting and committee members reported their thoughts on February's meeting, reporting that Keith Yagaloff, EW Selectman, attended as a resident, spoke in public participation for about 25 minutes. V. On-going projects

a. Birdhouses decorating project-Home Depot, out of stock/waitlist

Debbie reported that both Home Depot and Lowes still don't have the original birdhouses and it appears that there is not a date for when more will come in. Kristin told us that Paul Anderson here in the center of town might be helpful in constructing these birdhouses. Debbie was prepared to try Tractor Supply or store. Kristin spoke with someone from Home Depot, and they are not able to get them in stock. During the meeting, Sarah checked with Charlie Nordell and he confirmed he is willing to prepare birdhouses for \$10 per birdhouse.

b. Performance artist event (open mic) at Trolley Museum 4.27.24

We now have two performance artists; we are looking to get a few more folks before the April date. Debbie will ask Jason Bowsza to get it on his town phone announcement. We have one six-year-old singer and one baritone ukulele player.

c. EWHS Graduation Boards

Debbie and Rusty found some pallets; we don't have enough yet.

d. BBES Rock River

All the rocks are cleaned and buffed and scrubbed. There are 87 kids in this class. Last year we bought paint pens. Debbie donated two rocks for the rock river separation.
