4. APPROVAL OF THE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FIRST SELECTMAN TO SUBMIT A CIF GRANT APPLICATION ON BEHALLF OF THE TOWN AND FORWARDNG THE RESOLUTION TO TOWN MEETING.

First Selectman Bowsza advised the Board he is applying for a CIF Grant for the Community Center at the Scout Hall location. The purpose of this meeting is to approve the submission of the grant and enable the First Selectmen's Office to notice the Town Meeting for next Thursday, July 21, 2022.

The Board was provided with two template documents to consider. First Selectman Bowsza noted the Board of Finance has appropriated \$1.2 million of the total \$5 million Community Center Project. If Federal Funding is acquired \$2.8 million would be applied to the project cost; if this CIF Grant is received the total project funding would be \$3.8 million. All of this funding would lessen the impact to the local taxpayers and provide a new multi-service Community Center.

The Board considered both documents presented to them.
