could be the Broad Brook Library, the Warehouse Point Library, the Senior Center, Town Hall, Park Hill, and Spring Village. Discussion to continue at next meeting.

b) <u>Senior Center Update:</u>

The Commission briefly discussed the status of work towards a new location for the Senior Center. It was noted some surrounding towns have been successful by combining a senior center with a more generalized community center. As an example, South Windsor shares their senior center with the Park and Recreation Department services. Enfield has built a new center which provides senior services exclusively. Discussion of town-owned locations followed, including the Kogut property on Reservoir Avenue, Scout Hall, the Annex. Ideally a new senior center would provide a lunch area, smaller rooms for use for multiple activities, such as crafting, exercise classes, computer use, or a library. A canopied entrance would benefit the senior during inclement weather.

Research goals and charges of elderly commissions in other towns.
