The purpose is to identify slaves and place a memorial stone where they lived, worked or worship. It will be a challenge to research records as there was a fire at town hall in the 1960's that destroyed many records. The presenter stated that other records such as church records, land deed records and wills are sources of good information. This is a 4 week project and the cost is \$6,000.00.
