At tonight's meeting we received an in-depth presentation by Mr. Culliton regarding the Witness Stone Project. This project was created in order to bring awareness to slave life in Connecticut. This project is geared towards students in 8th grade

and above in addition to Social Studies curriculum. Currently there are 13 towns in CT participating or have participated in this project. The purpose is to identify slaves and place a memorial stone where they lived, worked or worship. It will be a challenge to research records as there was a fire at town hall in the 1960's that destroyed many records. The presenter stated that other records such as church records, land deed records and wills are sources of good information. This is a 4 week project and the cost is \$6,000.00. Mr Culliton explained that there are state funds that we can apply for in order to offset the costs. End of presentation.
