a. <u>IWWA #17-2022: 115 Scantic Rd – East Windsor Historical Society, owner. Approximately .57 acres of both tree planting and of Impervious pavement within the Upland Review Area.</u>

Wetlands Agent Miller advised the Commission that this application was for the construction of parking and a stormwater detention basin which are located within the Upland Review Area of a small farm pond on the adjacent property. Director of Public Works & Engineering Len Norton has indicated the drainage proposal is acceptable, while the drainage report provided by Mr. Ussery, of J. R. Russo & Associates, LLC indicates the pre-and post-development discharge rates decreased for the 2-year, 10-year, 25-year, and 100-year storms, thereby noting that the proposed development will not result in negative impacts downstream. Wetlands Agent Miller noted additionally that REMA Ecological Services, LLC conducted a site investigation of

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> the regulated wetlands and watercourses, and found no wetlandstype soils or regulated watercourses in the site development area.
