

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

Q2 Do you think the housing options currently available in East Windsor fit existing residents' needs?





Q4 Do you think Affordable Housing is an important component of East Windsor's prosperity?







Q5 What do YOU consider to be a reasonable monthly housing budget (rent/mortgage and utilities) in East Windsor? (Select all that apply)





Q6 Are you concerned with the overall cost of housing/homeownership in East Windsor?





Q7 How do you think increasing housing options in East Windsor would impact the Town?





Q8 In East Windsor, for whom do you think housing units are most needed? (Select top 2)





Q9 What types of affordable housing is needed in East Windsor? Please rank your choices (1 being the top priority).





Q10 Which area(s) of Town do you think are most desirable for additional housing units?






Q12 For demographic purposes, it is helpful to have a sense of household income and ownership status of those responding to this survey. Do you rent or own your residence?




