Good evening,

This is First Selectman Jason Bowsza reaching out to all residents of the Town of East Windsor.

There have been 13 new confirmed positive cases of COVID in East Windsor since last Wednesday. According to the Department of Public Health as of April 7, eighty-seven percent of East Windsor residents over the age of 75 have received at least one dose of vaccine, and ninety-five percent of residents between the ages of 65 and 74 have as well! Overall, East Windsor is at a rate of thirty-seven percent of our population vaccinated.

We continue to hold COVID vaccine clinics whenever possible, and we will be doing another clinic this Friday. We do still have about 100 slots available, so please call Community Services as soon as you can. For appointments or to be added to the waiting list, please call 860-623-2430. We will be offering Moderna, and anyone 18 years of age or older is eligible to sign up.

We also want to let people know that there are other vaccine location alternatives available. Appointments can be made by visiting CVS.com, Walgreens.com, Walmart.com/COVID or by calling the Vernon Regional Call Center at 860-896-4568.


The Town continues to offer COVID testing on Wednesdays from 10am to 3pm at the Town Hall Annex and is offered in partnership with Priority Urgent Care.

The Energy Assistance Program administered by the Town in conjunction with the State of Connecticut has been extended. Under the new guidelines, the last day to order fuel through the program will be May 20th, and the last day to apply for assistance is June 15th. For more information on that, call East Windsor Community Services.
