Good evening. This is First Selectman Jason Bowsza reaching out to all residents of the Town of East Windsor. A copy of this message, and more information about COVID-19, can be found on the Town's website.

We have had eleven cases of COVID-19 confirmed in East Windsor since last week.

The Town continues to partner with Priority Urgent Care to offer live virus testing and antibody testing every Wednesday from 10am to 3pm at the Town Hall Annex, 25 School Street, East Windsor. This is open to anyone, and all insurances are accepted. Depending on individual insurance plans, patients may be responsible for either a copay or deductible. People without insurance will be tested at no charge but do need to provide their social security number and birthdate. Anyone interested is strongly encouraged to schedule appointments ahead of time by calling 860-454-0678.

Last week, the Town of East Windsor partnered with our local health district to provide our first vaccine distribution clinic. We provided more than 100 doses of vaccine to citizens over the age of 75 years old. Tomorrow, anyone over the age of 65 will be able register in the Vaccine Administration Management System (VAMS). Anyone who needs help setting up a VAMS profile can call can contact the Senior Center, the Social Services Office, or the Parks and Recreation Office.


Our first vaccine was a success, and we look forward to hosting more as the opportunity presents itself to get more vaccine.
