





#### Mill Rate (current)











# FY25 Recommended Distribution of Funds Public Safety






# Police Department Year Over Year Comparison












# Public Safety Year Over Year Comparison



#### Distribution of Funds within Public Works






# Public Works Town By Town Comparison







# Community Services Funding Comparison












# Change in Grand List Comparisons
