Good evening,

This is First Selectman Jason Bowsza reaching out to all residents of the Town of East Windsor

There have been 13 new confirmed positive cases of COVID in East Windsor since last week.

We had a very busy week last week as a community. Between Thursday and Friday, town staff partnered with Southern Auto Auction to help distribute more than 1,300 boxes of food through a USDA Farmers to Families food box distribution program. We will be doing this again on March 25th at the Southern Auto parking lot located at 5 Phelps Road.

We also held another local COVID vaccine clinic at the Town Hall Annex. We were able to provide 167 doses of vaccine to people in our community. This is made possible through a partnership with the North Central District Health Department, Priority Urgent Care, and the Vernon regional COVID vaccine program. We are currently keeping a waiting list of East Windsor residents eligible to receive the vaccine and call that list whenever we are able to hold a local clinic. Unfortunately, that will not be available this week, as Governor Lamont has directed all available vaccine to be administered to public school staff.

Based on comments made by President Biden and Governor Lamont, we do anticipate vaccine supply to increase in the coming weeks. We are happy to maintain our town-based waiting list, but we also encourage people to try as many different avenues to get vaccine appointments as possible. Other alternatives may be through CVS.com, Walgreens.com, Walmart.com/COVID or by calling the Vernon Regional Call Center at 860-896-4568 or by calling 211. You can call 860-623-2430 to be added to the Town's waiting list, but our supply of vaccine is limited.
