Good evening,

This is First Selectman Jason Bowsza reaching out to all residents of the Town of East Windsor.

Yesterday, voters in town overwhelmingly approved three questions that were on the ballot: approval of the FY21/22 annual Town budget, which passed with 71% support; approval of a \$3.5 million added appropriation to pay down existing debt, which passed with 76% support; and approval of the Broad Brook Fire Department's inaugural budget under the new Town Ordinance, which passed with 64% support. I want to thank everyone who came out to exercise their votes in yesterday's referendum. Approval of all three questions will move the town forward in a positive direction!

By passing the Town Budget yesterday, the Town will save an additional \$10,000 by not requiring a second and third referendum this year.

This Saturday, the Connecticut Trolley Museum will be hosting a pair of fundraisers for the museum. More information can be found on the Trolley Museum's Facebook page.

Next Thursday, May 20th, the Town will be offering another Farmers to Families Fresh Food Box giveaway at 5 Phelps Road from 9am to 2pm. We will also be providing drive-through Johnson and Johnson vaccines from 9am to 1pm. No appointment is necessary.

The following day, the Town will be hosting a similar food and vaccine distribution event in Mill Pond Village. Appointments are strongly encouraged, so we can ensure enough food boxes are available. Appointments can be made by calling 860-623-2430.

Both of these events are made possible because of the Town's partnership with Priority Urgent Care and with Southern Auto Auction, and we thank them both for all of the assistance they've provided to our community as we recover from the pandemic.

Lastly, we are excited to announce that the East Windsor Summer Concert Series will be on June 10th. It will be held at East Windsor Park from 6:30pm to 8pm and will be our first opportunity to share the newly installed band shell with the general public. Please join us if you can!
