No one was present for RM18 Holdings LLC, Calamar Enterprises. There was a lengthy discussion regarding the calculation of the facility connection charge. Calamar had provided water records from their other properties. The connection charge was based on 57 gallons per day per unit. Mr. Tyler asked how the water flow will be measured. Mr. Enderle explained there will be two water meters. This property will be subject to a three year review for their facility connection charge.

Mr. Enderle explained that Newberry Village LLC, 2 Goldfinch Court, was an active adult residence; one-half of the FCC has been paid. No one was present for Newberry Village LLC.

Mr. Enderle reported that it had been a very busy month. The plant flow was up. Mr. Tyler asked at what point in capacity they would hear from the State. Mr. Enderle replied at 90%. Mr. Karolczuk completed and passed the QAQC test. He has been doing this test flawlessly for 22 years. They had to replace the DO meter. There was a sewer backup at 16 Dutch Hill (Depot St). Servpro was called in for cleanup and a claim was submitted to CIRMA. The staff televised the line and cut the roots in the line. There was also a backup at the Baymont Inn. The last time there was a backup there, Mr. Enderle contacted DEEP. It is a community sewer system; they have their own pump station. He was called about the backup, he went out and there was sewage coming up. He North Central Health and handed it off to Mike Caronna. Mr. Enderle explained that Mr. Alibozek is continuing his education at STCC. They would like to get network storage and a server. They would like to have their own webpage. Mr. Tyler asked Mr. Enderle to get some numbers for them. Mr. Anderson pointed out that Mr. Bednarz made the President's List at Manchester Community College again. There was a Certificate of Excellence for lab work thanks to Mr. Karolczuk.
