XII. Unfinished Business

a. FY2019-20 Budget . Review of New Information

Mr. Anderson asked if there was any new information. Mr. Enderle reported that he put in the health insurance numbers and moved somethings around. The rate is still at \$388. Mr. Tyler stated that if there is no substantial change, the Board will vote in April. Mr. Tyler will be out of the state at the time of the April meeting. He asked Mr. Enderle to email the final budget to him and hed give a proxy/absentee vote. Attorney Lanza suggested that the Board call Mr. Tyler on speaker phone for the budget vote.

b. IT Status

Mr. Alibozek reported that it is going well. They have straightened out the SCADA. There is a problem with Mr. Enderless printer and that will be taken care of tomorrow.

c. Benefit Assessment Policy

This was not discussed.

XIII. New Business

a. Bill Sheet Review

Mr. Anderson reported that they were 75% through the year and 69% of the budget had been expended.

b. Superintendents Report

Mr. Enderle reported that the flow this past month has been higher than he has ever seen it. It has been a very wet year. The delinquent bills were sent out for March 1st. The preliminary results for the WP 228 testing had been received and were acceptable. The results are graded either acceptable or unacceptable. Mr. Karolczuk has always had acceptable results. The work at the Scantic pump station has been completed. Mr. Enderle gave credit to Mr. Alibozek for his detailed planning of the project. There have been a number of meetings regarding Quarry Meadows. There has been a lot of maintenance and safety training. There were no after houron alarms this past month. Mr. Enderle said this is due to predictive maintenance and not reactive maintenance.

Mr. Enderle reported that the owner of the River Hollow Apartments had been late paying their bill again. Mr. Enderle sent a letter to the owner; the owner didnd like the letter. Mr. Enderle suggested he attend tonights meeting but the owner didnd see the need. Mr. Enderle is sending him another letter.

Mr. Enderle reported that there had been some confusion with Quarry Meadows regarding the pump station. Mr. Enderle, Mr. Alibozek and Attorney Lanza met with Mark OdNeill, Skip Kement and Marek Kement at 6:30 p.m. He is confident they have reached a solution and have a gentlemand agreement. Attorney Lanza will work on the bonding issues. Mr. Enderle explained that Quarry Meadows will be a 48 home development off of Depot St. Mr. OdNeill is going to purchase the property from Mr. Kement. Mr. Tyler said they will need to come in with a legitimate set of plans. Mr. Tyler asked if the sewer pipes that were installed without inspection would be checked. Mr. Enderle explained that Mr. OdNeill will be required to have the pipes televised and air tested; there will be a structural test of the manholes. Mr. OdNeill will be paying for this testing. There will be a sanitary sewer agreement and a developerd agreement.
